Please check the North Guildford Foodbank Facebook page for an up to date list of items that are needed - they welcome any long-life food, toiletries and household items and are this week particularly short of flour, tinned meat, tinned vegetables, rice and liquid laundry detergent.

Now some more usual ARAL business! Our gardener has been doing a great job over the past few months in trying to keep the moss at bay on the pavements. However it is a never ending task and I'm keen to try to keep the amount we pay out for this task to a minimum by asking everyone who is able, to please have a go at keeping their bit of pavement clear. I know many residents already do this and also keep the verges mowed and tidy which is very much appreciated by everyone. I have found that a good stiff outdoor brush is very effective especially now that the moss is dead and dried out.

Finally, a polite request for any dog walkers to please not deposit dog waste bags on the pavements or verges of Abbotswood, even if the intention is to collect it later. There are several residents who have complained recently and I have been asked to pass this request on.

Let's hope this lockdown will be able to be eased soon, but in the meantime take care.
